CLEMSON, S.C. – The No. 5 Clemson Tigers opened the 2017 season in grand fashion by defeating the Kent State Golden Flashes 56-3 at Memorial Stadium, with the 56 points marking the highest scoring output by the Tigers in a season opener since 1990.

Led by junior quarterback Kelly Bryant, who was making his first career start, Clemson compiled 665 yards on offense in the Tigers' first game as defending national champions. Bryant was especially efficient on the day, accruing 313 total yards, a program record for an opening game. Going 16-22 through the air for 236 yards, Bryant set the tone early by marching the Clemson offense down the field on three consecutive scoring drives in the first quarter.

Running back C.J. Fuller struck first, scoring on a 26-yard run. On the ensuing drive, Bryant connected with wide receiver Deon Cain up the seam for a 61-yard touchdown, putting Clemson up 14-0.

Late in the first, running back Adam Choice capped off a 10-play, 54-yard drive with a three-yard rushing touchdown, one of six rushing scores on the day for the Tigers. With 353 yards on the ground and four rushers clearing the 50-yard mark, the running game was an integral factor behind Clemson's commanding victory.

Bryant proved to be effective with his feet, as well as his arm, as the quarterback amassed a career-high 77 yards rushing

and scored on an eight-yard run late in the second quarter to send the Tigers into the half leading 28-3.

The second half saw several new faces for Clemson become involved in the offensive action as part of another 28-point half. True freshman running back Travis Etienne burst onto the scene with an impressive 54-yard carry and a four-yard score. Finishing as the game's leading rusher, Etienne compiled 81 yards on the ground.

Freshman quarterbacks Zerrick Cooper and Hunter Johnson made an impact, with the two newcomers splitting time in the second half and playing well. Cooper, who went 4-6 for 37 yards, made a splash with a 14-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Cornell Powell in the third quarter, which served as the first career touchdown for both Cooper and Powell.

The running game continued to pay dividends for the Tigers out of the half, as the Tigers increased their lead to 42-3 early in the third quarter by way of Fuller's second rushing score of the contest and a 47-yard dash to the end zone by sophomore running back Tavien Feaster soon afterward.

Limiting Kent State to 120 yards of total offense, including one passing yard, the Tiger defense produced a complete performance in the win. Kendall Joseph led the Clemson defenders with eight tackles.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Powered by a defense that sacked Auburn's quarterback 11 times, the No. 3 Clemson football team defeated No. 13 Auburn 14-6 at Death Valley on Saturday night. With the win, Clemson improves to 2-0 on the year, while Auburn drops to 1-1.

Junior quarterback Kelly Bryant led the offensive charge for Clemson, passing for 181 yards and rushing for 68. On defense, Clemson was sparked by Dorian O'Daniel, whose 14 tackles—10 in the first half—were a career high for the redshirt graduate linebacker. Junior defensive lineman Christian Wilkins added another 10 tackles, and junior defensive end Austin Bryant had four of Clemson's 11 sacks.

Auburn scored the only points of the first quarter just under eight minutes in on a Daniel Carlson 24-yard field goal that capped off the first drive. They doubled their lead early in the second quarter, this time on a 28-yarder by Carlson.

Clemson took its first lead with less than a minute left in the first half on a three-yard touchdown rush by junior quarterback Kelly Bryant. The 12-play scoring drive was highlighted by 29-yard pass from Bryant to junior receiver Ray-Ray McCloud on third down, and Clemson found the end zone two plays later. Following the Bryant score, Clemson had a 7-6 lead at halftime.

Bryant opened the scoring in the second half, capping off Clemson's first drive of the half with a 27-yard rushing touchdown to give his squad a 14-6 lead early in the third quarter. That proved to be the final score, as the Clemson's seven second-half sacks limited Auburn to 15 total yards with -25 rushing yards in the second half.

LOUISVILLE, KY. – Six different Tigers scored at Papa John's Stadium on Saturday night as No. 2 Clemson defeated the No. 14 Louisville Cardinals 47-21 in the Tigers' first road game and ACC opener. With the win, Clemson remains undefeated at 3-0 overall and 1-0 in conference play, while Louisville drops to 2-1 overall and 0-1 in the ACC.

Junior quarterback Kelly Bryant powered Clemson's offense on Saturday, passing for a career-high 316 yards and rushing for 26 yards with two touchdowns in his first road start. Junior wide receiver Ray-Ray McCloud was Bryant's most popular target, totaling a career-high 115 yards with a touchdown on seven catches. Redshirt junior kicker Greg Huegel, graduate linebacker Dorian O'Daniel, redshirt junior running back Adam Choice and freshman running back Travis Etienne all also put points on the board for the Tigers.

The Tigers struck first, scoring on their opening drive on a Bryant eight-yard touchdown run five minutes into the first quarter. After two three-and-outs in their first two drives, Louisville tied the game late in the first quarter on

an 11-yard scoring pass from Lamar Jackson to Charles Standberry. A Huegel 31-yard field goal gave the Tigers a 10-7 lead just over midway through the second quarter, and that lead increased to 16-7 after a Bryant 79-yard touchdown pass to McCloud with a missed extra point. The first half ended with a career-long 49-yard field goal by Huegel that put the Tigers up 19-7 at the break.

O'Daniel opened the second half scoring when he returned an interception 44 yards for his first career score, and Bryant ran in a one-yard quarterback keeper for a touchdown to give the Tigers a 33-7 lead in the third quarter.

Jackson found Jay Smith for a 36-yard touchdown to start the fourth quarter to cut the Clemson lead to 33-14, but the Tigers responded with a 39-yard scoring run by Choice on the ensuing drive put Clemson at the 40-point mark. The Cardinals found the endzone on an eight-yard touchdown pass from Jackson to Dez Fitzpatrick, but the Tigers had the last word with their longest score of the day, an 81-yard scoring run by Etienne with just over 6 minutes remaining in the game.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Four fourth-quarter touchdowns led the No. 2 Clemson Tigers to a 34-7 win over the Boston College Eagles on Saturday afternoon at Death Valley. With the win, Clemson remained undefeated at 4-0 overall and 2-0 in the ACC, while Boston College dropped to 1-3 on the year and 0-2 in conference play.

On offense, the Tigers were powered by the run game, as all five of their touchdowns came on foot. Kelly Bryant rushed for a career-high 106 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries, and Travis Etienne, who ran for 113 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries. Defensively, Clemson was sparked by Trayvon Mullen and A.J. Terrell, who both hauled in their first career interceptions, and Kendall Joseph, who had 10 first-half tackles.

The Tigers struck first, breaking a scoreless tie midway through the second quarter on a 94-yard drive that was capped by a Bryant

11-yard touchdown run. That proved to be the only scoring of the first half, and Clemson took a 7-0 lead into the break. Boston College evened the score at 7-7 late in the third quarter when AJ Dillon ran in a one-yard touchdown, and the Tigers and Eagles entered the fourth quarter tied.

Clemson took the lead for good on its opening drive of the final quarter on a six-yard touchdown run by Adam Choice, set up by a 23-yard pass from Bryant to Diondre Overton on the previous play. An Etienne 50-yard rushing touchdown put Clemson up by 14 late in the fourth quarter, and Bryant scored on a four-yard quarterback keeper with just under three minutes left in the game. The Tiger offense was not done, however, as Terrell's interception set up a 41-yard scoring drive that saw Etienne find the endzone on a 10-yard scoring run with less than a minute remaining in the contest.

With the win, Clemson remained undefeated at 5-0 on the year and 3-0 in the ACC, while Virginia Tech dropped to 4-1 overall and 2-1 in conference play.

Virginia Tech attempted and missed a 45-yard field goal as time expired in the first half, and Clemson took a 17-3 lead into the break.

The Tigers also opened the second half scoring, as Feaster gave the Tigers a 24-3 lead on a one-yard rushing score after O'Daniel recovered a Hokie fumble. The Tigers maintained that lead entering the final quarter, as the defense stopped a Virginia Tech fake field goal attempt in the final seconds of the third quarter.

Virginia Tech narrowed the Clemson lead to 24-10 a minute into the first quarter when it scored its first touchdown, a Sean Savoy two-yard run. O'Daniel's pick six came on the Hokies' next drive, putting the Tigers up 31-10. The Hokies scored the final points of the matchup with less than two minutes left in the game on a Josh Jackson 30-yard touchdown pass to Savoy.

The No. 2. Clemson Tigers (6-1, 4-1) lost their first contest in 11 months as part of a 27-24 upset victory by the Syracuse Orange (4-3, 2-1) at the Carrier Dome, ending a 20-game win streak for the Tigers over ACC Atlantic Division foes.

Outgaining the Tigers by 123 total yards, the Orange were led by a dominant showing from quarterback Eric Dungey, who went 20-32 for 278 yards and three touchdowns. Dungey and the Orange offense fired on all cylinders from the start, as Syracuse converted a 10-play, 72-yard drive into points on the game's opening possession. Connecting with running back Dontae Strickland on a 23-yard touchdown pass, Dungey provided the Orange with an early 7-0 lead.

Clemson was quick to answer the bell, however, with a three-play, 62-yard scoring series taking place on the Tigers' first possession. With a 37-yard burst into the end zone, Clemson running back Tavien Feaster knotted the game up at 7-7. Feaster finished with 57 yards on seven carries.

Following a missed field goal on the next Clemson drive, Syracuse took advantage soon afterward, as Dungey found receiver Ervin Phillips wide open up the seam for a 66-yard touchdown, giving Syracuse a 14-7 lead. Phillips led all pass catchers with 94 yards receiving on the night. Clemson evened the score later in the period, as safety Tanner Muse returned a fumble 63 yards for a score, marking the third defensive touchdown of the season for the Tigers and the second career touchdown by Muse against Syracuse. On the ensuing possession, the Tigers produced a goal-line stand, limiting the Orange to three points.

Trailing 17-14 at halftime, Clemson was forced to go without starting quarterback Kelly Bryant in the second half due to injury, as he exited the game late in the second quarter. Therefore, Zerrick Cooper was under center for the Tigers for the remainder of the game, going 10-14 for 88 yards.

Cooper and the Tiger offense used ideal field position on a series early in the third quarter to convert it into points, with Clemson kicker Alex Spence tying the game up at 17-17 with a 30-yard field goal.

Syracuse quickly regained the lead, however, driving 82 yards in four plays thereafter to take a 24-17 lead. Highlighted by a 45-yard run from Dungey, the possession was capped off by a 30-yard touchdown pass from Dungey to wideout Steve Ishmael with just over seven minutes remaining in the third quarter.

Clemson then reciprocated with an electrifying drive of its own, as running back Travis Etienne broke free for a 52-yard dash to the house, leveling the score at 24-24. The rush marked Etienne's fourth run of over 50 yards this season and also provided him with his sixth touchdown on the year.

The Tigers had an opportunity to take the lead late in the third period, as they started a drive at the Syracuse 41-yard line, but a missed field goal dashed that chance and enabled Syracuse to gain some breathing room with a made field goal on its next possession.

Featuring multiple clutch third and fourth-down conversions, the series that proved to be the winning drive for Syracuse was capped off by a 30-yard field goal by Orange kicker Cole Murphy with 9:41 remaining in the contest. Clemson attempted a pass on a fake punt just inside of Syracuse territory on its final possession but failed to convert, leading to a six-minute drive by the Orange that featured a critical conversion on third and 11, which ultimately enabled Syracuse to run out the clock.

In the 27-24 victory, the Orange maintained possession of the football for nearly 35 minutes, using lengthy, efficient drives to earn the win. Going 8-19 on third-down conversions and 2-2 on fourth-down conversions, the Orange offense was poised when it mattered most, which paid dividends.

Despite the defeat, several Tigers experienced quality performances, such as Etienne, who amassed 68 yards on just five carries to average 13.6 yards per rush on the evening. On the defensive side of the ball, defensive end Clelin Ferrell came up with 3.5 sacks, a half of a sack shy of the Clemson single-game record, and linebacker Kendall Joseph led all defensive players with 12 tackles.

The No. 7 Clemson football team picked up its 300th all-time win in Death Valley on Saturday, defeating the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets by a score of 24-10. With the win, Clemson improved to 7-1 overall and 5-1 in the ACC, while Georgia Tech fell to 4-3 on the year and 3-2 in conference play.

Offensively, the Tigers were led in both rushing and passing by quarterback Kelly Bryant, who ran for 67 yards on 12 carries and threw for 207 yards and two touchdowns on 22 completions. The Clemson defense, who held the Yellow Jackets to negative passing yardage until late in the fourth quarter, totaled 11 tackles for loss by eight different players.

The Tigers jumped out to an early 7-0 lead just two minutes into the game after Van Smith recovered a Georgia Tech fumble on the Yellow Jackets' first drive, and Bryant connected with Deon Cain for a 38-yard score two plays later. Georgia Tech cut into the Tigers' lead with five minutes remaining in the first quarter on

a 25-yard Brenton King field goal, set up by a KirVonte Benson 65-yard run earlier in the drive. Milan Richard hauled in a 20-yard touchdown pass three minutes later to put the Tigers up 14-3.

Clemson scored the only points of the second quarter with just over three minutes left in the half when Travis Etienne punched in the endzone from two yards out, and the Tigers took a 21-3 lead into the break.

An Alex Spence 29-yard field goal made up the only points of the third quarter, and a TaQuon Marshall 22-yard touchdown run with just under five minutes left in the game rounded out the scoring.

The No. 6 Clemson football team handed No. 20 NC State its first ACC loss of the year on Saturday, defeating the Wolfpack 38-31 at Carter-Finley Stadium on Saturday. With the win, Clemson improved to 8-1 overall and 6-1 in the ACC, while NC State slipped to 6-3 on the year and 4-1 in conference play.

Offensively, the Tigers were sparked by Deon Cain, who was Kelly Bryant's favorite target and amassed 84 yards on a career-high nine catches, and Tavien Feaster, whose 89-yard rushing touchdown in the third quarter was tied for the third-longest run in Clemson history. Defensively, Ryan Carter shone for Clemson, who had three pass breakups and hauled in a fourth-quarter interception that set up the Tigers' final score of the game.

NC State got on the board less than two minutes into the contest, turning a Tim Kidd-Glass interception at the Clemson 40-yard line into a touchdown three plays later, when Ryan Finley connected with Kelvin Harmon for a 40-yard scoring pass. Clemson evened the score with nine minutes left in the first quarter on Ray-Ray McCloud's 77-yard punt return touchdown, the Tigers' first since 2014. Jaylen Samuels then gave the Wolfpack a 14-7 lead late in the first quarter on a one-yard scoring run.

The Tigers found the endzone less than a minute into the second quarter when Kelly Bryant ran for a 10-yard touchdown, bringing the score to 14-14. NC State regained the lead a few minutes later, as Finley

connected with Samuels for a seven-yard touchdown that put the Wolfpack up 21-14. An Alex Spence 26-yard field goal cut the Wolfpack's lead to 21-17 with five minutes remaining in the first half. Each team then went on to miss a field goal, and 21-17 was the score heading into the break.

Cain opened the third quarter scoring with only three and a half minutes left in it on a 12-yard scoring pass from Bryant, putting the Tigers up 24-21. As time was expiring in the quarter, Feaster broke loose for his 89-yard touchdown run, giving Clemson its largest lead of the game heading into the final quarter.

Finley found Jakobi Meyers for a 15-yard score just two and a half minutes into the fourth quarter, narrowing Clemson's lead to three points. On the Wolfpack's next drive, Carter's interception allowed for the Tigers to drive down and retake a 10-point lead on Bryant's second rushing touchdown of the day. A Kyle Bamard 22-yard field goal left Clemson's lead at a touchdown with just under two minutes remaining in the game, and the game ended with K'Von Wallace intercepting Finley's final pass with no time left on the clock.

CLEMSON, S.C. – The No. 4 Clemson football team clinched a spot in the 2017 ACC Championship game after defeating the Florida State Seminoles by a score of 31-14 in Death Valley.

With the win, Clemson improves to 9-1 overall and 6-1 in the ACC, while Florida State drops to 3-6 overall and 3-5 in conference play.

Offensively, the ground game powered the Tigers, as all four of Clemson's touchdowns were via a run, one each from Kelly Bryant and Adam Choice and two by Travis Etienne. Bryant finished the game with 60 yards on 19 carries, and Etienne ended with 97 yards on 14 carries. On the defensive side of the ball, Van Smith led the way with an interception on what could have been the Seminoles' go-ahead drive. Smith also had five tackles, and J.D. Davis and Christian Wilkins topped the Tigers with seven tackles apiece.

Clemson scored the only points of the first quarter with just under three minutes left in it when Bryant pushed two yards for his 10th rushing touchdown of the season.

Etienne found the endzone with six and a half minutes left in the second quarter, breaking through traffic and powering 28 yards to cap off a one-play drive, set up by a Ray-Ray McCloud 35-yard punt return. The Tigers finished the first half with a 26-yard Alex Spence field goal and took a 17-0 lead into halftime after limiting Florida State to just 46 yards in the first 30 minutes.

The Seminoles tallied their first points with just over a minute left in the third quarter when Jacques Patrick rushed three yards for a score that cut the Tigers' lead to 17-7. Florida State then cut Clemson's lead to just three points midway through the fourth quarter when James Blackman connected with Ryan Izzo for a 60-yard touchdown pass.

On the ensuing Clemson drive, the Seminoles forced and recovered a fumble, but Smith's interception regained Clemson possession just one play later and paved the way for another Etienne rushing touchdown that put the Tigers up 24-14 with three minutes remaining in the game. Choice scored the Tigers' final points of the matchup on a 10-yard touchdown run that ended a drive in which he amassed 28 of his 40 rushing yards on three carries.

CLEMSON, S.C.--Playing in front a Memorial Stadium crowd for the final time in 2017, the No. 2 Clemson Tigers raced to a dominant 61-3 victory over The Citadel Bulldogs, accruing a season-high 479 passing yards in the process.

Living up to the hype surrounding the Senior Day and Military Appreciation Day festivities, the Tigers used a balanced offensive attack to improve to 10-1 on the year while dropping The Citadel to 5-6.

The Tigers took a 21-0 lead in the first quarter, as quarterback Kelly Bryant connected with wide receiver Deon Cain on a 53-yard bomb during Clemson's first possession, putting the Tigers up 7-0. Bryant was very effective under center, going 17-22 for 230 yards and three touchdowns. As for Cain, he experienced one of the best games of his career, compiling a career-high 140 receiving yards on five catches.

On the next series, The Citadel turned the ball over, as Clemson cornerback Trayvon Mullen picked off a pass for his second interception of the year. Soon afterward, Tigers running back Travis Etienne punched it into the end zone from six yards out. Mere minutes later, Bryant capped off an eight-play, 69-yard drive with a 12-yard touchdown pass to wideout Hunter Renfrow, marking Renfrow's first score of the season.

Early in the second quarter, Clemson increased its lead to 28 points when receiver T.J. Chase found the end zone for the first time in his Clemson career on a 13-yard strike from Bryant. Clemson kicker Alex Spence sent a 26-yard field goal through the uprights on the ensuing Clemson drive, and, with under a minute to play in the first half, quarterback Zerrick Cooper threw a touchdown pass to wideout Tee Higgins to provide the Tigers with a commanding 38-point advantage.

Higgins experienced a breakout performance in the contest, with the freshman amassing 178 receiving yards, the most for any Clemson player this season, on six receptions, two of which resulted in touchdowns. The aforementioned score came on a spectacular catch in which Higgins was somehow able to corral the ball after it was tipped in double coverage.

Not to be outdone, running back Tavien Feaster opened up the second half with a flashy 61-yard burst to the house for six, finding open space up the middle for his fifth rushing score of the season. Etienne answered with his second touchdown of the afternoon on Clemson's next series, scoring on a seven-yard carry for the 11th rushing touchdown of the season, the most in program history for a freshman.

Later in the third quarter, the Tigers padded their lead, as quarterback Hunter Johnson entered into the scoring action with a 78-yard touchdown pass to Higgins, which marked Johnson's longest completion as a Tiger. After miraculously making an incredible over-the-shoulder grab, Higgins bolted down the left sideline for his second end-zone appearance of the day. Higgins led all pass-catchers in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns in the matchup.

In the fourth quarter, Clemson kicker Christian Groomes was successful on a 38-yard field goal for the first successful field-goal try of his career. The Bulldogs answered with a field goal of their own later in the period, but Clemson linebacker Shaq Smith put a bow on the Tigers' 61-3 win over The Citadel thereafter with his first career interception.

Reaching the 10-win mark for the seventh straight season, Clemson outgained The Citadel by 446 yards to wrap up its home slate. All three quarterbacks who made an appearance for the Tigers on the day amassed over 100 yards through the air, with Johnson totaling 144 passing yards and Cooper picking up 105 such yards to go along with Bryant's game-high 230 yards.

In addition to the multitudinous offensive standouts, the Tigers boasted several quality defensive performers in the victory. Making his first career start, linebacker James Skalski stepped up in a major way by collecting a game-high nine tackles. Also of note, senior Clemson linebacker Dorian O'Daniel amassed five tackles in his final game at Death Valley, and Tigers defensive end Albert Huggins garnered five tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Using a balanced offensive attack, the No. 3 Clemson Tigers toppled the South Carolina Gamecocks 34-10 at Williams-Brice Stadium, marking the fourth consecutive victory for the Tigers in the Palmetto Bowl.

Outgaining South Carolina by 262 yards and accruing 17 more first downs, Clemson was the aggressor on offense. The Clemson defense was stellar as well, shutting out the Gamecocks through the first three quarters and keeping South Carolina quarterback Jake Bentley in check for most of the contest.

In fact, a defensive highlight for the Tigers resulted in the first score of the evening, as Clemson cornerback Ryan Carter picked off a pass for the second time this season and sprinted into the end zone on a 12-yard return, providing Clemson with a 7-0 first-quarter lead.

The Tigers tacked on 13 more points in the second quarter to push their lead to 20-0, as quarterback Kelly Bryant led Clemson on two scoring drives. Bryant was rather effective in the game, going 23-34 for 272 yards and two touchdowns, also adding 26 yards on the ground.

On a drive that featured multiple long pass plays, Clemson running back Tavien Feaster scored a rushing touchdown, powering across the goal line midway through the second quarter to give Clemson a 14-0 advantage. Later in the period, Clemson converted three third downs on a touchdown-scoring drive, including a third-and-goal that saw Bryant connect with wideout Hunter Renfrow for a four-yard score.

Renfrow provided the Tigers with even more breathing room right out of the gate in the second half, scoring on the first play from scrimmage in the third quarter on a riveting 61-yard receiving touchdown. Complete with several impressive evasive moves that fooled defenders, Renfrow's run put Clemson ahead by 27 points, providing Renfrow with his first multi-touchdown game of the season.

On the next series, the South Carolina offense continued to struggle, as Clemson cornerback Trayvon Mullen stepped in front of a Bentley pass to secure an interception, marking the Gamecocks' second turnover of the night. A few possessions later, Clemson put together a 13-play, 69-yard drive that featured a critical 13-yard run by Bryant on fourth down to extend the drive deep in South Carolina territory.

Soon after, the series was capped off by a five-yard rushing touchdown from Clemson running back Travis Etienne, giving Clemson a 34-0 lead that it carried into the fourth quarter. The Gamecocks scored 10 points in the final period, though, converting a pair of Tiger interceptions into points.

South Carolina wide receiver Bryan Edwards scored the lone touchdown of the contest for South Carolina after securing a pass over the middle from Bentley and then bolting down the left side and into the end zone for six. However, a lack of quality offensive plays, such as that one, over the course of the entire game doomed South Carolina, helping Clemson to earn the 34-10 road victory.

Moving to 11-1 on the year, the Tigers dropped the Gamecocks to 8-4, handing them their second home loss of the season. Clemson had possession of the football for 11 minutes more than South Carolina, with the Tigers' offensive proficiency serving as the primary factor behind the win.

In addition to Renfrow, who finished with four catches for 75 yards, Clemson wideout Tee Higgins played quite well on the receiving end, hauling in three receptions for 84 yards. Other noteworthy performances for Clemson included Etienne picking up 41 rushing yards on nine carries, including his 12th touchdown of the year, and Carter collecting three solo tackles and a pass deflection to go along with his aforementioned interception.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Fueled by a balanced offensive attack and a stifling defensive performance, the No. 1 Clemson football team won its third straight and 17th all-time ACC Championship, defeating the No. 7 Miami Hurricanes 38-3 on Saturday at Bank of America Stadium. With the win, Clemson improved to 12-1 overall, while Miami moved to 10-2.

Offensively, the Tigers were sparked by Kelly Bryant, who completed his first 15 passes for 164 yards and finished the game with 252 yards and one passing touchdown on a career-high 23 completions after connecting with 10 different receivers. The ground game proved strong as well, as four different Tigers rushed for scores. The Clemson defense held Miami to just 22 yards of offense in the first quarter and 214 for the whole game while also forcing three Hurricane turnovers in the third quarter alone.

Travis Etienne put Clemson on the board first, darting four yards for a touchdown just under five minutes into the matchup. The score was set up when Bryant connected with Renfrow on third down for a 23-yard gain a few plays earlier. A Miami 46-yard field goal attempt then sailed wide left, and on Clemson's ensuing drive, Bry-

ant broke free for an 11-yard scoring run that gave the Tigers a 14-0 lead near the end of the first quarter. The junior quarterback was also a perfect 9-9 passing for 124 yards during the first 15 minutes.

Adam Choice upped Clemson's lead to 21-0 two minutes into the second quarter with a one-yard touchdown run. That proved to be the halftime score, and the 21-point advantage was good for the largest halftime lead in ACC Championship game history.

Five minutes into the second half, an Alex Spence 46-yard field goal pushed the Tigers' lead to 24-0, and Ryan Carter forced a fumble that was recovered by Dorian O'Daniel on the Hurricanes' next drive. The Tigers did not score on that possession, but Carter halted Miami again a few minutes later with an interception in Hurricane territory. Clemson did find the endzone then, with Tavien Feaster powering 11 yards and putting the Tigers up 31-0.

Kendall Joseph caused Miami's third turnover of the third quarter with just under two minutes left in it when he intercepted a Malik Rosier pass, and Bryant connected with Deon Cain for a 27-yard score two plays later. Miami scored its only points on a 22-yard by Michael Badgley with three and a half minutes remaining in the game.
